1 Samuel 13,14




The Philistines mustered a mighty army of 3,000 chariots, 6,000 charioteers, and as many warriors as the grains of sand on the seashore! (1 Samuel 13:5)



Saul and Jonathan and the troops with them were staying at Geba...The Philistines set up their camp at Micmash. Three raiding parties soon left the camp of the Philistines. (1 Samuel 13:16,17b)



1 Samuel 14:1-14



One day Jonathan said to his armor bearer, "Come on, let's go over to where the Philistines have their outpost." (vs. 1a)




Faith prompts me to act!




Some things are worth fighting for.




Sometimes you have to go it alone.



Meanwhile, Saul and his 600 men were
camped on the outskirts of Gibeah,
around the pomegranate tree at Migron.
(vs. 2)




Perhaps the Lord will help us, for nothing can hinder the Lord. He can win a battle whether he has many warriors or only a few!” (vs. 6)



And this is the victory that has overcome
the world, our faith. (1 John 5:4)




Faith changes the dynamics of what could be, or even what shouldn't be, to what can be.



Jonathan climbed up, using his hands and feet, with his armor-bearer right behind him. The Philistines fell before Jonathan, and his armorbearer followed and killed behind him. In that first attack Jonathan and his armor-bearer killed some twenty men in an area of about half an acre.
